### Crime Types

To better reflect the work, crime type categorizations, which describe the most serious charge on a given complaint, have changed and been added over time. The table below summarizes any crime types that have been added or modified since 2011, with additional information provided where available.

290 Failure to Register	Created in March 2014. Previously tagged under "Sex Crime" or under the crime type for the originating conviction.
Attempted Homicide	Created in March 2013.
Burglary	De-activated in 2013. Replaced with more specific crime types (see below).
Burglary-Auto	Created June 2013. Previously tagged under "Burglary."
Burglary-Commercial	Created June 2013. Previously tagged under "Burglary."
Burglary-Residential	Created June 2013. Previously tagged under "Burglary."
Child Abduction	Created March 2014. Previously tagged under "Child Abuse."
Child Abuse	De-activated in 2014. Replaced with more specific crime types (see below).

Domestic Violence	De-activated December 2015. Now categorizing the various crimes under the Domestic Violence umbrella by their specific type, which for the most part include, Assault, Threats, and Stalking.

DUI with Injury	Created in March 2014. Previously tagged under "DUI."
Elder Abuse	De-activated in 2014. Replaced with more specific crime types (see below).

Variable	Description
Incident.Number	Police incident report number
Arrest.Date	The date of the arrest
Case.Filed	Y/N for whether the case was filed by SFDA
Court.No	San Francisco Superior Court case number, unique to each defendant per incident
Status.CtNum	The SFDA charging status of the case per court number. The case can be 'filed,' 'other action,' or 'Discharge Only'
Mis.Arrest	TRUE/FALSE for whether it was a misdemeanor arrest
Month.Year	A month-year abbreviation of the arrest date
Index	An index for the month-year combination for proper ordering in graphing
Most Serious Crime Type	The most serious crime type among the charges presented by the police. Determined by matching charges in a case to an office-produced designation of seriousness of charges
Suspect.Crime.Type	The most serious crime type among the charges presented by the police. Determined by matching charges in a case to an office-produced designation of seriousness of charges, but with burglary separated into auto-burglary and burglary
Case Type Ct	The most serious case type among the charges presented by the police for a given court number – Felony, Misdemeanor arrest
Action Taken Ct	Yes/No for whether some action, either filed or other action, was taken on a court number

Variable	Description
UniqueID	A unique identifier consisting of the type-arrest date-court number
Court_No	San Francisco Superior Court case number, unique to each defendant per incident
Incident.Number	Police incident report number
Arrest.Date	The date of arrest
Filing.Date	The date of filing
Filed.Case.Type	Abbreviation for the most serious case type among the charges filed by SFDA for a given court number – F=Felony, M=Misdemeanor, I=Infraction, and NULL=Missing
Crime.Type	Abbreviation for the most serious crime type among the charges filed by SFDA
Crime.Description	The most serious crime type among the charges filed by SFDA
Month-Year	A month-year abbreviation of the arrest date
Document.Name	Denotes whether the case was a motion to revoke (MTR) probation or mandatory supervision, or a felony or misdemeanor filing
Document.Date	The date on which the MTR was filed
Type	MTR – a motion to revoke probation or mandatory supervision; NF – a new filing
Index	An index for the month-year combination for proper ordering in graphing
Crime Type Aggregate	<p>The most serious crime type for the case aggregated to the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ASLT – Assault</li> <li>• AUTO – Auto theft</li> <li>• BURA – Auto-burglary</li> <li>• BURC – Commercial burglary</li> <li>• BURR – Residential burglary</li> <li>• DRUG – Drug law violation</li> <li>• DUI – Driving under the influence</li> <li>• GUN – Gun law violation</li> <li>• ROBB – Robbery</li> <li>• STAY – Stat away order violation</li> <li>• THFT – Theft</li> <li>• VAN – Vandalism</li> <li>• OTHER – A category that bins together all other types of crimes that each make up a very small percentage of the caseload. <b>Variable</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Index</b>	A unique identifier for each defendant-jury trial combination
<b>CourtNumber_x</b>	Court numbers associated with a given defendant-jury trial
<b>Case Type</b>	Abbreviation for the most serious case type for a given defendant-jury trial – F=Felony, M=Misdemeanor, and NULL=Missing
<b>Outcome</b>	The unique outcome for each defendant in a given trial: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dismissed</li> <li>• Guilty/Sustained/True</li> <li>• Mistrial</li> <li>• Not Guilty/Not Sustained/Not True</li> <li>• Plea-Felony</li> <li>• Plea-Misdemeanor</li> </ul>
<b>Jury Sworn Date</b>	Date the jury is sworn and the trial commences
<b>Trial End Date</b>	Date the verdict is delivered (or plea is entered) and trial ends
<b>Co-Def</b>	Y/N indicator for if the trial involved co-defendants
<b>Trial Length Days</b>	Number of calendar days between jury sworn date and trial end date
<b>Convicted</b>	Convicted/Not Convicted indicator for if the case ended in a plea or a guilty verdict
<b>Concluded</b>	Concluded/Not Concluded indicator for if the case reached a resolution by guilty or not guilty verdict, plea, or dismissal. Mistrials are pending matters that are categorized as “Not Concluded”
<b>Trial Outcome Agg</b>	Convicted/Mistrial/Not Convicted aggregating trial outcomes to three levels. Convicted includes guilty and plea outcomes. Not convicted includes not guilty and dismissed outcomes.
<b>Case Type Full</b>	The most serious case type for a defendant-jury trial – Felony, Misdemeanor, Mental Health, NULL
