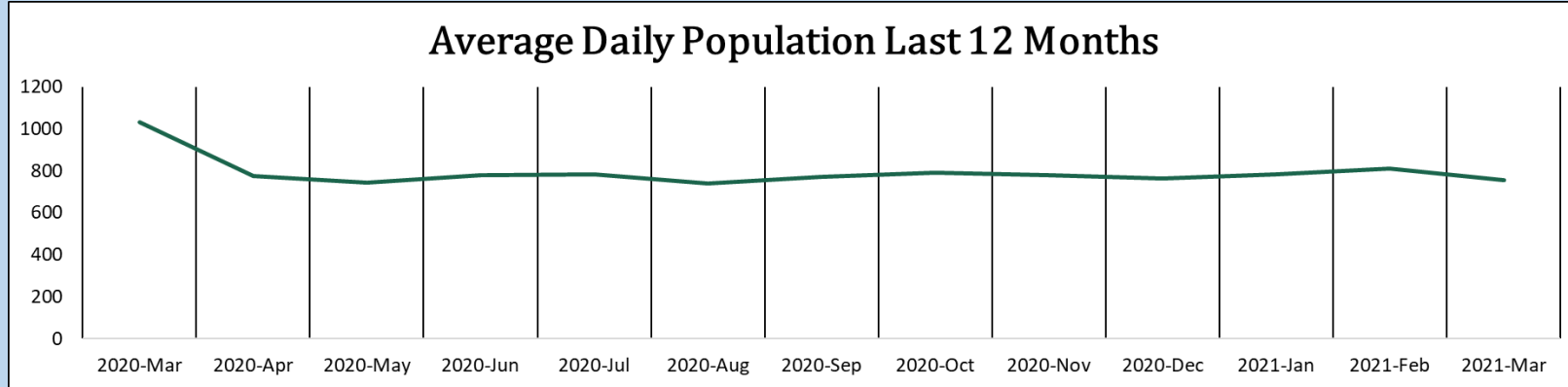

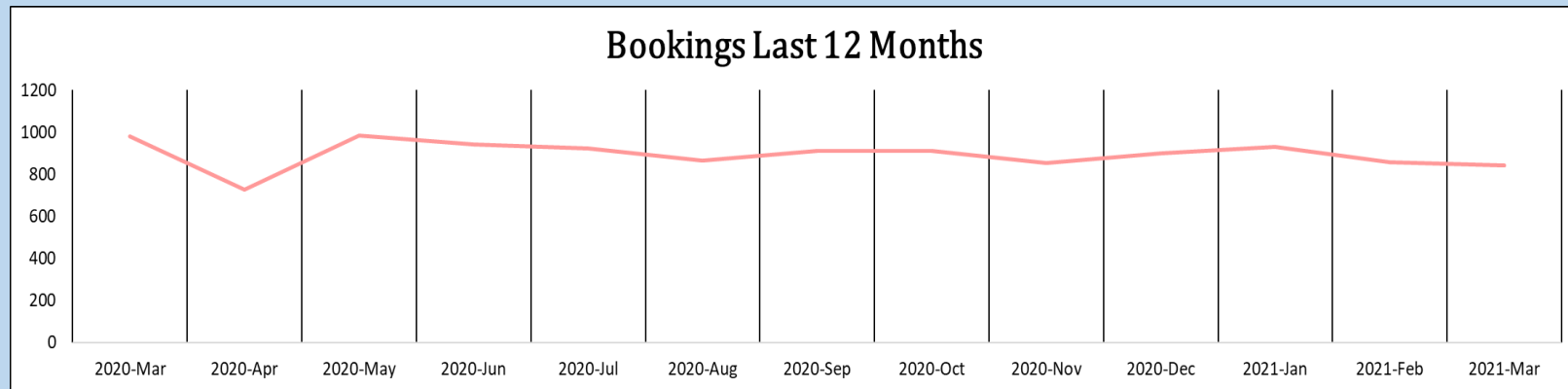

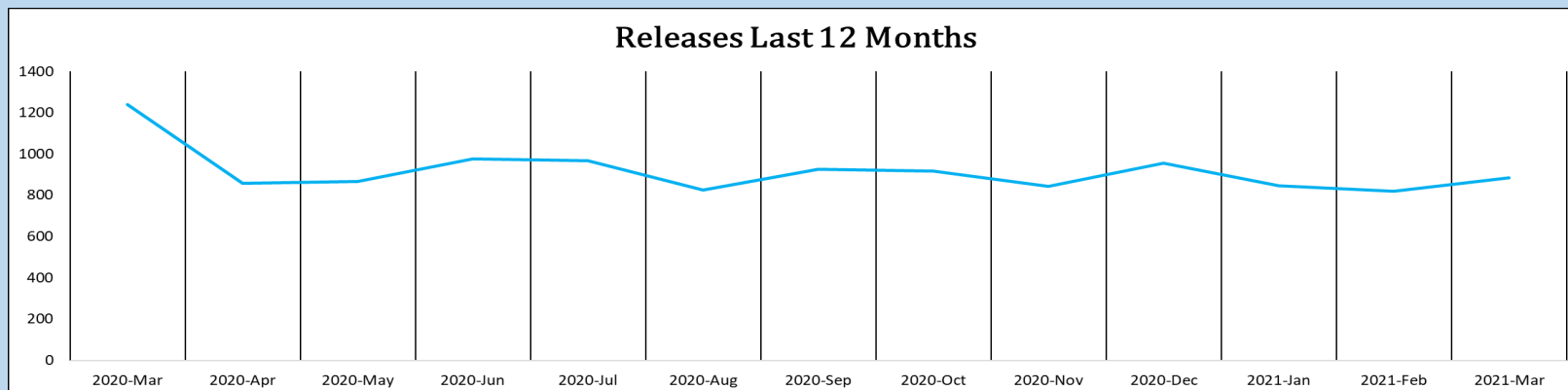

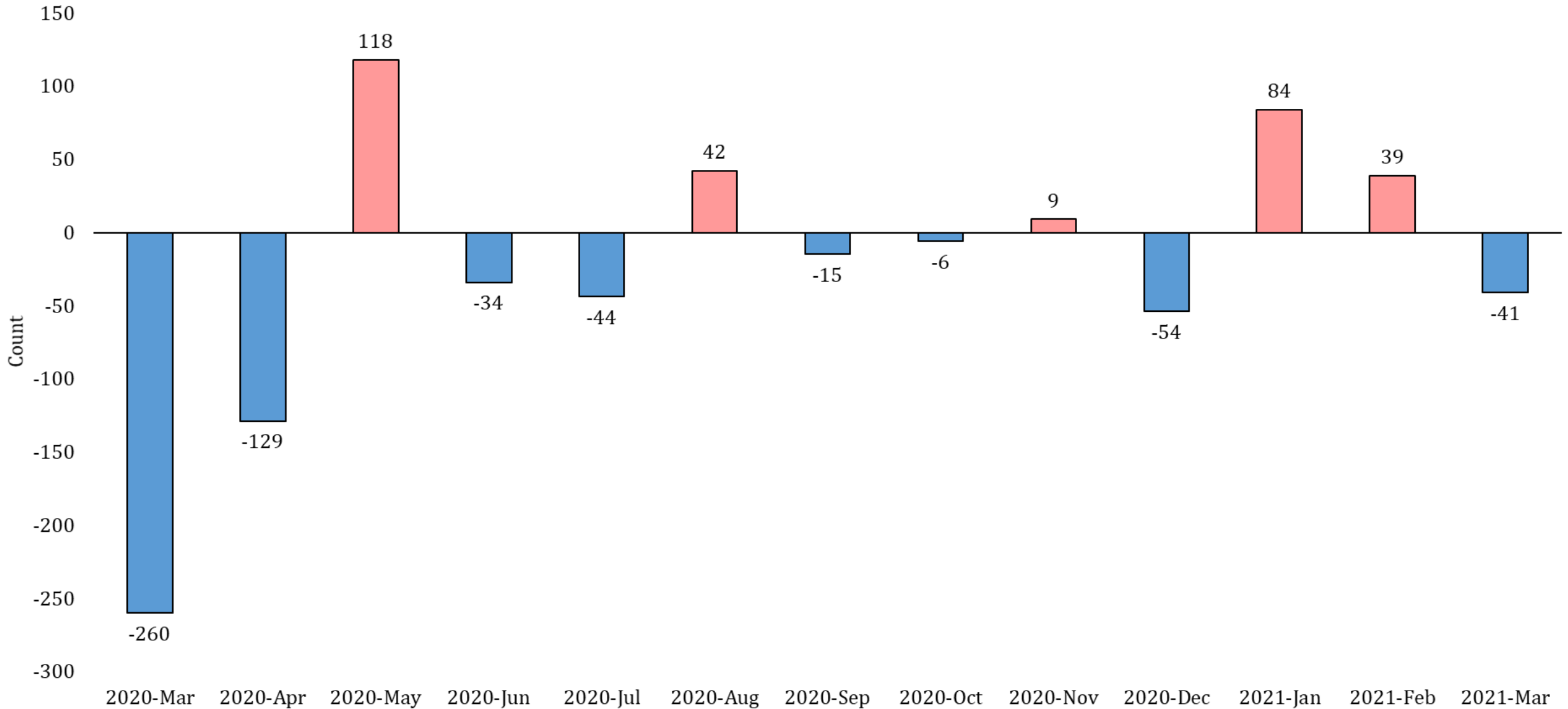

Snapshot Population March 2021

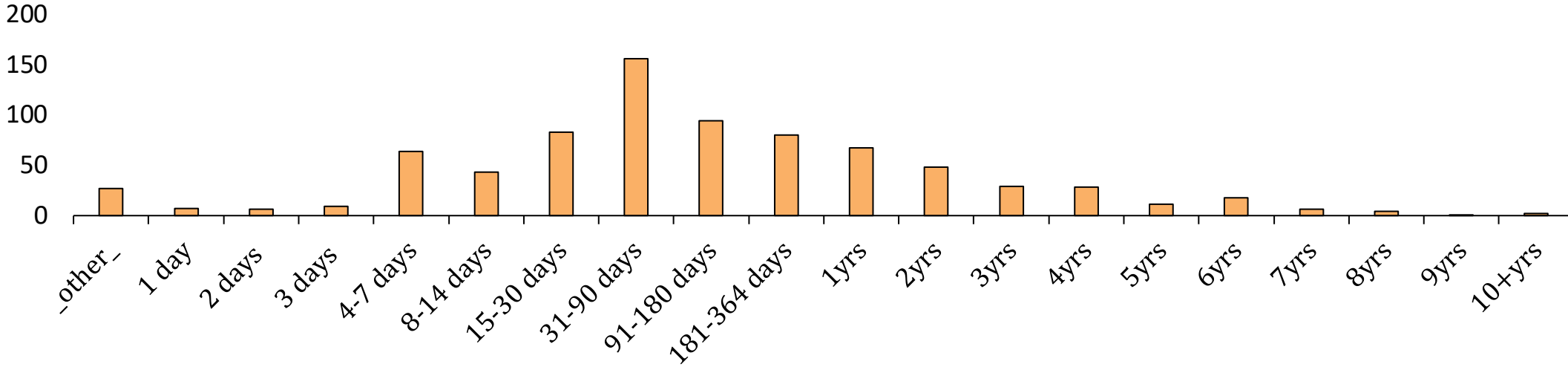
Time in custody for snapshot population on March 16, 2021

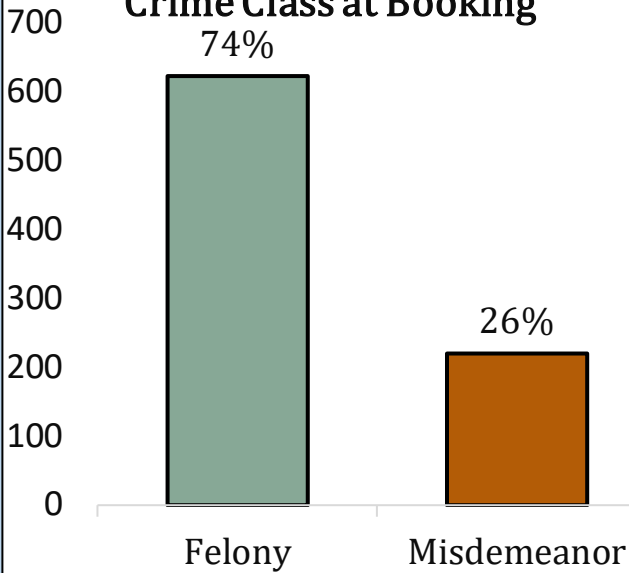

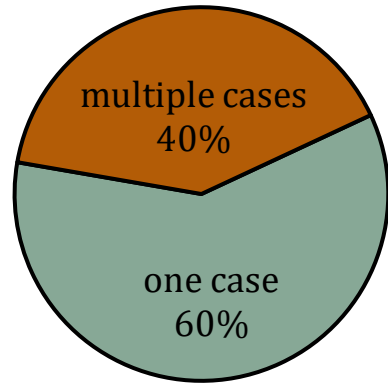

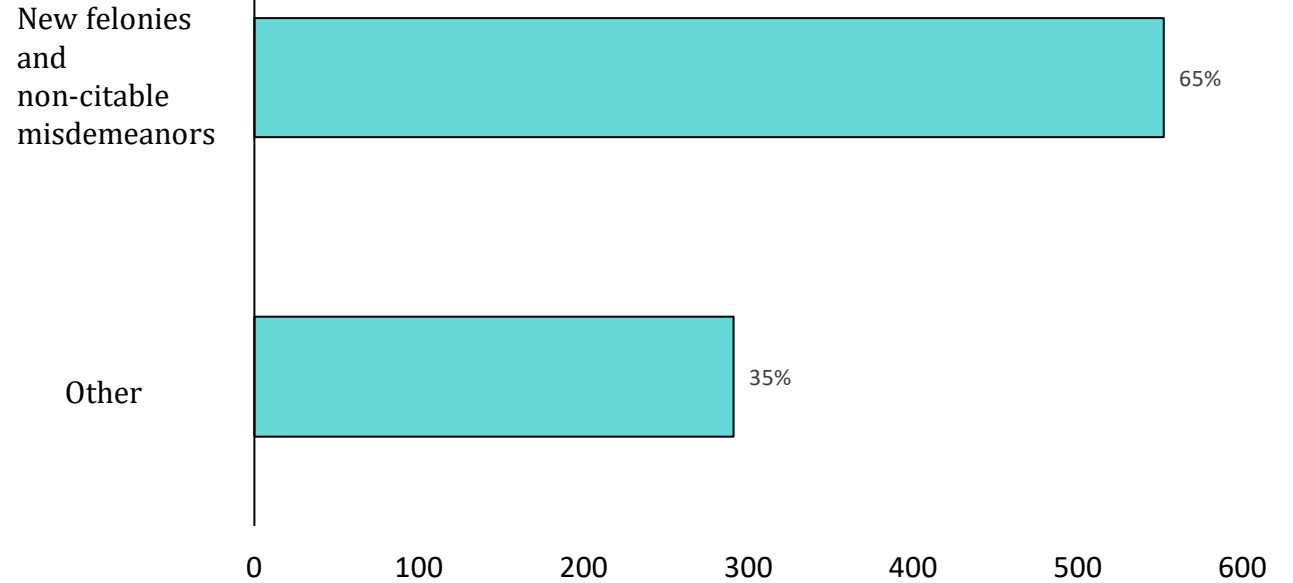
Crime Class at Booking



Cases per Booking Number



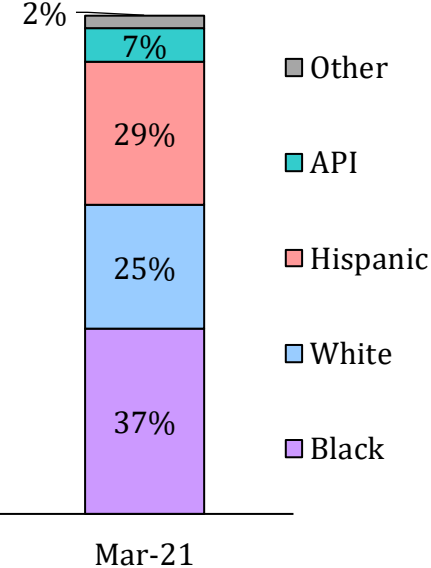

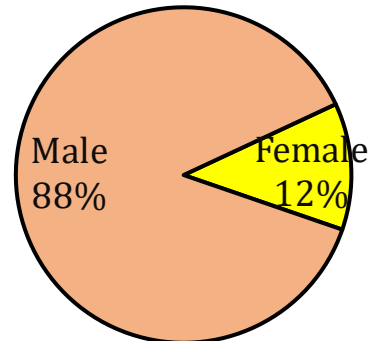

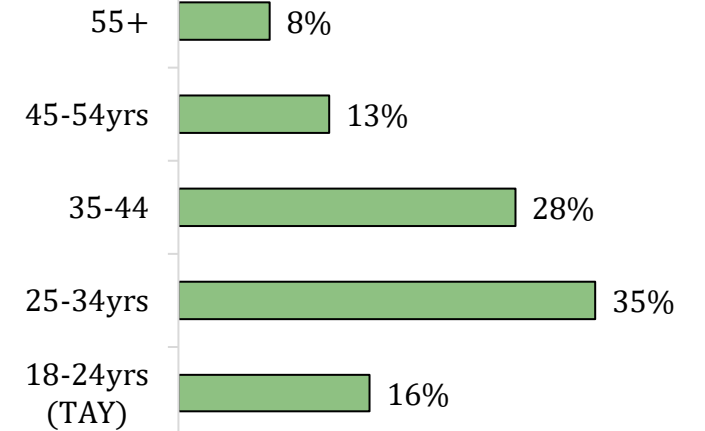
Ethnic and Race Percent

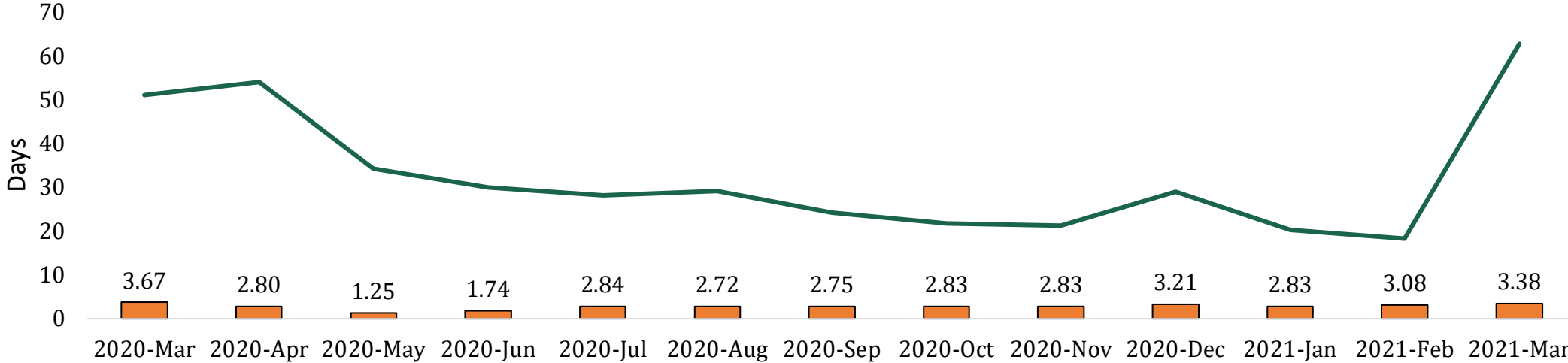

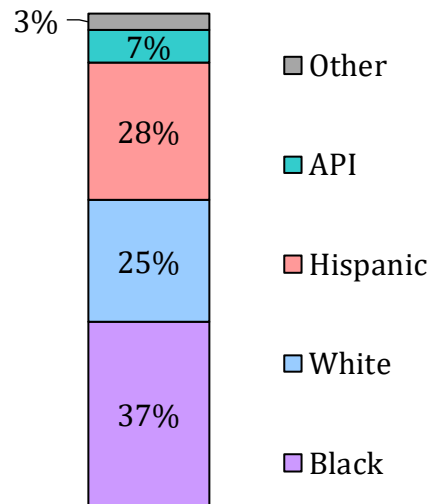

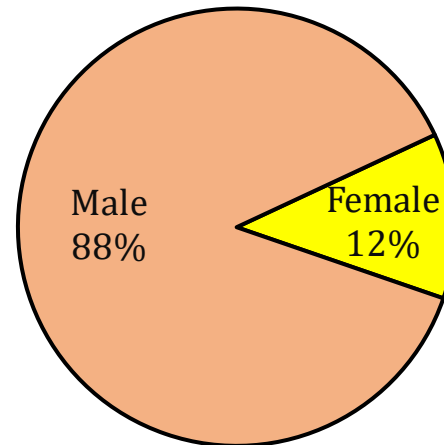

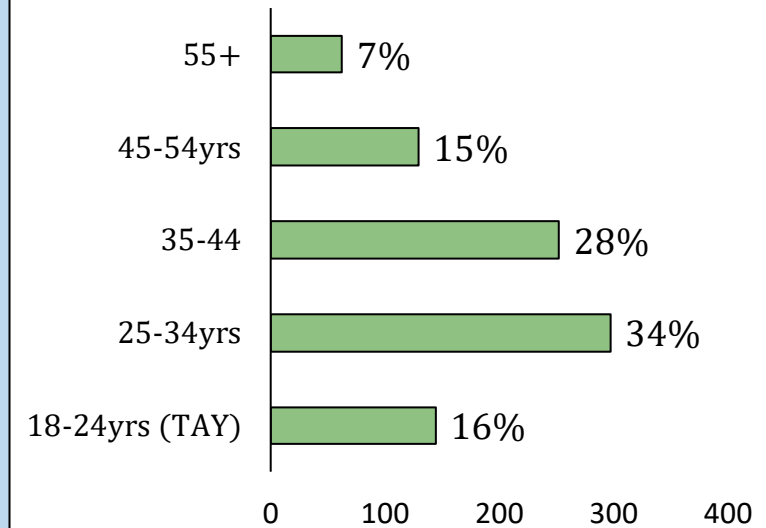
