

NARCOTICS ARRESTS BY TYPE OF ALLEGATION

There has been a dramatic decline in narcotics arrests in 2020 and 2021, but a growing proportion of these arrests have been for sales or intent to sell, rather than for possession or other lower-level drug offenses.




The decline in narcotics arrests has been driven by decreases in arrests for simple possession (HS 11377 or HS 11350) and possession of drug paraphernalia (HS 11364). By contrast, possession for sales (HS 11351 and 11351.5) have remained more consistent over time.




NARCOTICS ARRESTS BY SEVERITY

Correspondingly, the proportion of arrests for misdemeanor drug charges has decreased.



NARCOTICS ARRESTS BY NEIGHBORHOOD


The proportion of narcotics arrests that occur in the Tenderloin is increasing. Overall, narcotics arrests are decreasing in other neighborhoods, while remaining consistent in the Tenderloin.



Prosecution of Narcotics Cases


SF DA ACTIONS TAKEN IN RESPONSE TO NARCOTICS ARRESTS PRESENTED

The rate at which the District Attorney's Office prosecutes narcotics cases has increased as arrests have been for more serious conduct.



FILING RATES FOR NARCOTICS CASES BY SEVERITY

The filing rate for felony drug cases has increased, while the filing rate for misdemeanor narcotics cases has decreased.



PROSECUTION OF NARCOTICS CASES BY TYPE


Since DA Boudin came into office, the San Francisco District Attorney's Office has prosecuted over 1,100 narcotics cases, of which more than 1,000 have been for sales or intent to sell narcotics.



Resolutions of Drug Cases


RESOLUTION OF NARCOTICS CASES BY SEVERITY
